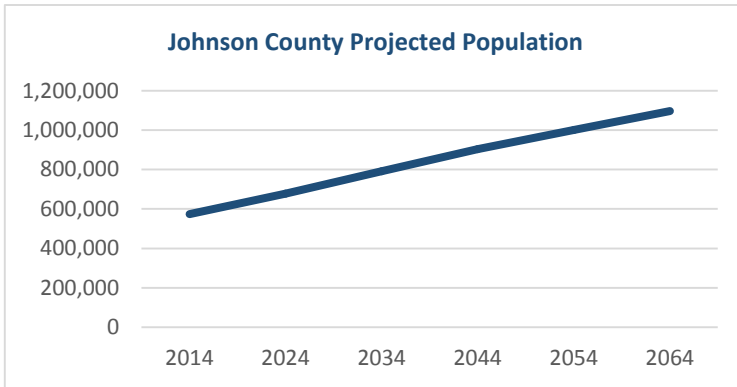




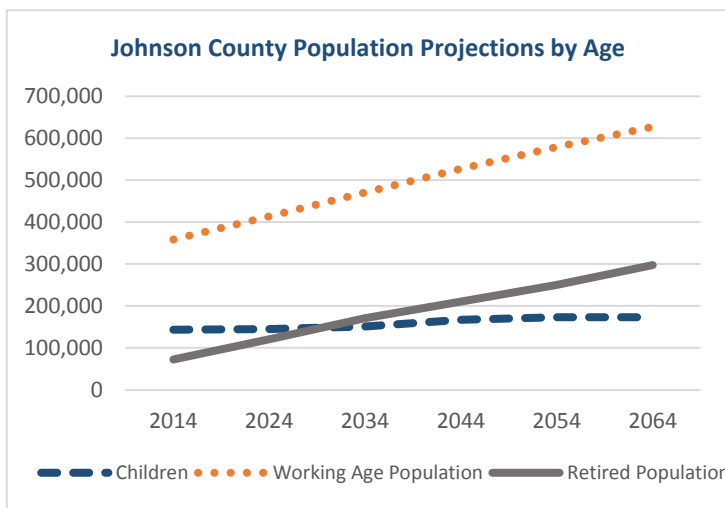
**Johnson County Population Projections, 2014-2064**

UCS analysis of projections by the W. Frank Barton School of Business,  
Center for Economic Development and Business Research, Wichita State University

**Population Change:** Over the 50 years projected, the Johnson County population will nearly double. Population is expected to increase from 574,272 in 2014 to 1,096,662 in 2064, a 91% increase. Statewide, population will increase from 2.9 million to 3.5 million. Based on projections, Johnson County will account for 82% of the statewide population growth.



**Population Change by Age:** County residents under the age of 18 are projected to total 172,830 by 2064, only 20% more than in 2014. Johnson County working age (18 to 64 year old) population is projected to increase by 75% over the 50 year period, to a total of 626,774. The County population that is over 65 years old is forecast to increase 309%. The number of retirement age residents is projected to be 297,057 in 2064.
