

2019 Indicators by County

Data by more than 80 indicators is presented by county - Johnson and Wyandotte in Kansas, and Cass, Clay, Jackson and Platte in Missouri. The Platte County data for 2016 and 2017 is limited in scope due to sample size for some indicators. Due to the Platte County limitations, a five county total column, rather than six county, is also presented. For some indicators, as noted on the worksheets, indicator data for the MSA is presented in the five-county column. Cells with yellow highlights indicate data that varies significantly from prior year(s)

Multi-County Indicator Trends

Prior to 2016, the multi-county indicator trends worksheet represented the total of six counties. For 2016 and 2017, the multi-county indicator trends represents the total of five county indicator data - Johnson, Wyandotte, Cass, Clay, and Jackson. Platte County is not included. 2019 data represents six counties, inlcuding Platte County data. For some indicators, as noted on the worksheet, indicator data for the MSA is presented in the multi-county column.

County Data

Each county profile includes data on multiple indicators for five years, with 2019 the most current data.

The counties are Johnson and Wyandotte in Kansas, and Cass, Clay, Jackson and Platte in Missouri. The Platte County data is limited in scope for 2016 and 2017 due to sample size for some indicators.
