11,879 residents on average each month received Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (**SNAP**) benefits in 2023.




8,225 women, infants and children received food, nutrition education and health screenings through the **WIC Supplemental Food Program** in 2022.





2,360 people in Johnson County were provided assistance through **LIEAP** (Low Income Energy Assistance Program)

JOHNSON COUNTY CHILDREN




429 children, on average each month, were in foster care or some other out-of-home placement in 2023.







Johnson County Households Receiving Housing Assistance 2018-2023




Johnson County SNAP Recipients by Family Type in 2022
