After Capitol Hill Day Follow-Up with Legislators

After Capitol Hill Day, it's important to follow up with legislators – whether you were able to meet with them or not – to build your relationship with them, offer to give them a tour or more information about your work (if applicable), and let you know that you are a resource.

Sample Template - If you met with them:

Dear Senator/Representative,
