



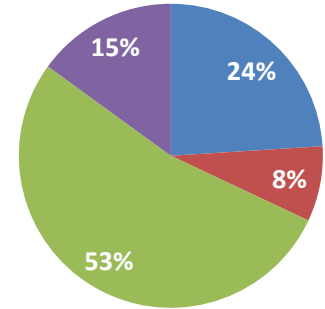
**U.S. Census Bureau Releases 2019 Poverty Estimates  
Johnson County Poverty Level Nearly Unchanged**

**Population**

Johnson County saw an overall population increase of 5,019 people, or less than 1% from 2018 to 2019, with an estimated total population of 595,909, according to U.S. Census American Community Survey 2019 1-Year Estimates.

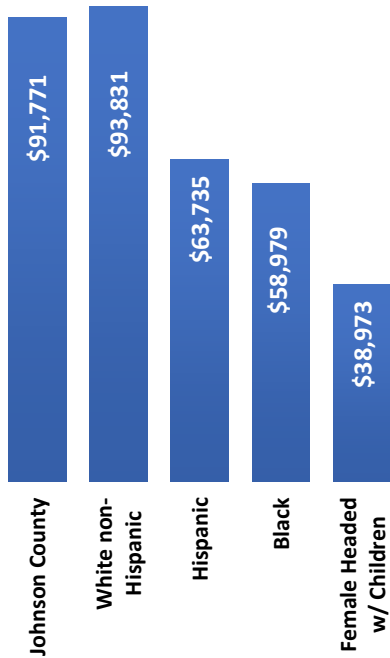
Nearly 1 in 4 of all Johnson County residents are under the age of 18. The largest age group increase in 2019 was in the 65 years and older population. This group increased in number by nearly 5%, or 3,899 people.

**Income**

While median household income has increased across demographic groups over the past four years, there are significant racial and ethnic disparities in income in Johnson County. Median income for all households in Johnson County is \$91,771. For white non-Hispanic households, the median income is \$93,831, while in Black households and Hispanic households' median income is just 63% of the median income for white non-Hispanic households. Women headed household income in Johnson County continues to lag behind the rest for the fourth year at \$38,973. One in five female headed households with children live at or below the Federal Poverty Level (FPL).

**2019 Federal Poverty Thresholds**

- 1 person: \$12,490 per year
- 2 persons: \$16,910 per year
- 3 persons: \$21,330 per year
- 4 persons: \$25,750 per year
- 5 persons: \$30,170 per year

**Poverty**

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that Johnson County's 2019 annual average unemployment rate was at a 5-year low of 2.8%. Despite the low rate of unemployment, the percentage of people living at or below the

Federal Poverty Level in Johnson County has seen little change since 2015. In 2019, 5% of Johnson County residents (31,774 people) were living at or below 100% FPL (\$21,330 or less for a family of three).

The total number of people living in "low-income" households (those at or below 200% FPL, or \$42,660 or less for a family of three) decreased by 1,609 to 80,782. This was a notably smaller decrease than in 2018 (7,769 fewer between 2017 and 2018).
